Overall Learning Reflection of TAL - 4

I am glad to have this privilege of participating in such an wonderful course. I was looking forward to learn how I can include topics, ideas as a content in the class so that it would be more acceptable and beneficial in terms of professionalism to students. I expected to learn several ways to set Evaluation rubrics in order to evaluate students properly. I wondered if I can learn how to manage students in terms of classroom discipline, proper attention in lectures, regular attendance and so on. I was thinking I am weak in managing disruptive behavior of students sometime, therefore, I was looking forward for a lesson regarding this. In addition we practiced to formulate course objectives and learning outcomes as on hand experience for our courses that is being taught regularly.
